

life giving, anxiety filled and a time of great searching.



TIPS FOR JOURNALING

- 1. Underline or highlight key words or phrases in the Bible passage. Use a pen or highlighter to mark new discoveries from the text.
- 2. Put it in your own words. Read the passage slowly, then rewrite each phrase or sentence using your own words.
- 3. Reflect:
 - How do you see yourself and our world in the text? And if you don't, why not?
 - If you could ask God any question about this passage, what would it be?
 - What can we learn about humanity in this text?
 - What is something you want to carry with you from this passage today — whether that be a promise, a question, or a practice?
- 4. Close in prayer.








BIBLE READING CHALLENGE: THE MINOR PROPHETS

Our Fall Bible Reading Challenge is to read the minor prophets! These prophets are no less important than others like Isaiah or Jeremiah. Their books are simply shorter. Prophets were sent by God to address the issues God's people were facing or involved with at the time. Each of these minor prophets offers a unique experience of God's love and call to justice.

These texts can be confusing, so it is important to spend a little time discovering the background of these texts before diving in. Watch the accompanying Bible Project video overview and/or read the introductory pages in a Study Bible. Even though these prophets were speaking so long ago, their call to do justice and live faithfully for God alone echoes strongly today.

This reading challenge offers short readings just five days a week. A reading calendar with tips for making this challenge a meaningful and faith filled practice is on the next page.
